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To whom it may concern:

I am writing to you to discuss my experience with Diana Emrich of Weichert Realtors and Jim Ernst of Artique Custom Homes. Let me start by saying that this is not my first experience building with Jim Ernst. In 2008, I decided to build a house in Lexington after building in Georgetown with a large company. I could not find a floor plan that I liked, so I showed my realtor a floor plan from another builder with some alterations that I would want for the home. Jim was able to make suggestions and incorporate both the floor plan and alterations into a beautiful home that was named the Caydence after my oldest daughter. We lived in that home on Orchard Grass for 10 years before we ran out of space. We never had any issues with the structure, electrical wiring, appliances, HVAC, or anything with the home. She was there at the initial meeting, multiple meetings about the design of the home, the plan approval, the excavating of the land, the framing, selections, the walk throughs, and closing. She was our go to person. Diana and I drove all around Lexington and Nicholasville to pick out various selections for the house. She was great about giving suggestions when asked and giving me all the time I needed to choose. I remember not liking the lightening from Lowe's or Home Depot. Diana provided a dollar amount for the lighting allowance and allowed me to pick fixtures from multiple places.

Did I mention that Diana is the person whom designed our home? We really lucked out on finding a person who could do it all. Diana listened to my requests/needs and then drafted some plans to utilize space wisely and provide each of my children with their own room. We also requested that each floor have a different open area for each age group of children for play or gaming needs. When I would go to the property to check on progress, I would run Jim and he was always available to answer my questions and show me the progress. He is so meticulous to details that it is amazing. With the other company I had to stop going to the site until the drywall was up as everything looked like a jumble of cords, vents, and pipes. Things were cut at odd angles and appeared to be super glued together. Not with Artique. I enjoyed watching the build and seeing how the wires flow smoothly down the 2x4s with holes drilled for them to travel and they are tied together so they are easy to locate. It was seamless! The duct-work for the HVAC system wasn't a jumbled mess, it was nice rows of ducts that flowed through the house. I still remember being close to the end of the build and one day the fireplace was in and the next day it was gone. I asked Diana what happened and she said Jim measured and the fireplace was not perfectly aligned so he requested the company re-do the work. I appreciated that he took the time to not rush through, but take the time to make sure everything was correct the first time.

As I stated before, this is our dream home. It is our last home to build and it is flawless. I do not anticipate having any issues out of this home just like I didn't on Orchard Grass. If any issues arise, I have the utmost confidence that Jim and Diana will make any repairs without hassle.
